To be successful in this venue and all other areas of photography as well, one must understand EXPOSURE and the relationship of:

A ISO

B f stops or aperture opening

C shudder speed or exposure time

There are two areas that Jack and I have experimented with, Table Top Set Ups and out of doors.

EQUIPMENT-- General

Camera body with bulb setting Velveteen for back drop Two light stands

Flashlights of various sizes plus 400,000 to 1 million candle power search lights

Lazer pointer Sturdy tripod Manual release

Color filters—to place over flashlights

Clamps, Tape
Cover for view finder
Tiki torches
Flares

Sparklers
Viewfinder cover
Baseball cap

Table Top specific

Crystal wine decanter
Varied glasses and mugs Can be filled with any object that reflects light

Most important—100% dark work space

Before working under the stars check the moon phase, remember the darker the better. Arrive before dark to allow enough time for set up.
